## PROPOSALS

### Proposal number one, an amendment

#### Amendment to Protect Against Unequal Treatment

This proposal would protect against unequal treatment based on ethnicity, national origin, age, disability, and sex, including sexual orientation, gender identity and pregnancy. It also protects against unequal treatment based on reproductive healthcare and autonomy.

A "YES" vote puts these protections in the New York State Constitution.

A "NO" vote leaves protections out of the State Constitution.

The wording used in the description to the left is misleading. It doesn't tell you what is on the "other side of the coin". It doesn't tell you how it will destroy girls' and womens' sports, how it will affect your rights as a parent, how illegals will benefit and citizens and legal migrants will pay the price. Nor does it tell you how it could be a basis for non-citizens to vote in New York elections, or how your taxes will be used.

The so-called "Equal Rights Amendment" would constitutionalize discrimination against women, girls, tax-paying citizens, and parents in the perverted name of "anti-discrimination".

### Official Ballot for the General Election - November 5, 2024

#### Instructions

1. Mark the oval to the left of the name of your choice. 
2. To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, print the name clearly in the box labeled "Write-In", staying within the box.
3. Any mark or writing outside the spaces provided for voting may void the entire ballot.

#### County of Ontario

4. To vote on a question or proposal, mark the oval below your choice.
5. The number of choices is listed for each contest.
6. Do not mark the ballot for more candidates than allowed. If you do, your vote in that contest will not count.

7. If you tear, deface or wrongly mark this ballot, return it to a poll worker and obtain another. Do not attempt to correct mistakes on the ballot by making erasures or cross-outs. Erasures or cross-outs may invalidate all or part of your ballot. Prior to submitting your ballot, if you make a mistake in completing the ballot or wish to change your ballot choices, you may obtain and complete a new ballot. You have a right to a replacement ballot upon the return of the original ballot.
8. After completing your ballot, insert it into the ballot scanner and wait for the notice that your ballot has been successfully scanned. If no such notice appears, seek assistance of an election inspector.
